### Outreach Beyond Bible Fellowship - Dr. Timothy Hawkins

It's spring, the season of growth; a time where the beauty of God's creation presents itself as if on parade. During each day of creation, God looked at what He made and declared it good. And at the end, when man and woman were created in His own image, the Bible says, "And God saw everything that He had made, and behold, it was very good."

God was delighted and still delights in us, His creation. He made us a reflection of His own glory. Remember, we are all created in the image of God! Each and every one of us has a place and a purpose in His kingdom.

You, my friend, are uniquely made by God, with a unique personality. You have certain strengths that you can use to positively impact the people you meet in your life, and in doing so, you will be fulfilling God's will for your life. Our ability, skills, and compassion are embedded into the fabric of our church. By learning together to embrace our varying gifts, worship Him with joy, and love our neighbors unconditionally, we are empowering everyone to join the mission of God. How can we love our neighbors unconditionally? Well, one important way is through outreach.

#### What is Outreach?

"Outreach" is defined as "an activity of providing services to any populations who might not otherwise have access to those services." A key component of outreach is that the group providing it is willing to seek out and help those in need where they are. Where services provided by the government are not complete, outreach can fill in the gap.

#### Why Must We Do Outreach?

There are many reasons why we as a church must provide outreach to those in our community. But the number one reason is because God commands it. There are several verses that tell us as Christians to reach out to others. 1 Peter 4:10 states, "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." (English Standard Version).

We don't all have the same gifts, but we all have at least one gift. And we must use those gifts to serve others, ultimately showing the love of Christ in that service.

In verses, James 2:14-17, the question is asked what good it is to have faith without works. If we see someone who is struggling to put food on the table or clothes on their backs and all we say is, "I'm praying for you," how does that help them? (Continued Page 3)

meet up for lunch or a movie and then your friend stands you up?

Many people swear by something simply to be more believable. They'll say, "I swear on a stack of Bibles!" or "Cross my heart and hope to die!" to give them greater credibility; and then they still won't honor their promise. When it only happens once or twice, it's easier to forgive. But when they make it a habit, people around them quickly learn that they can't be trusted.

It's especially hard when that kind of friend professes to be a Christian. We are followers of Christ: it is imperative to keep our word.

Why Is It Important As A Christian To Keep Your Word?

Swearing is described as someone making a promise to someone else, or threatening something with an oath towards another person. Swearing also refers to calling a person as a witness. The Bible discusses the seriousness of swearing, or making a vow. Jesus himself warns us about making frivolous vows. James 5:12 says, But above all things, my brethren, swear not, neither by heaven, neither by the earth, neither by any other oath: but let your yea be yea; and your nay, nay; lest ye fall into condemnation.

Jesus further clarifies the dangers of spontaneous promises in Matthew 5:33-37: Again, ye have heard

that it hath been said by them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord thine oaths: But I say unto you, Swear not at all; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne: Nor by the earth; for it is his footstool: neither by Jerusalem; for it is the city of the great King. Neither shalt thou swear by thy head, because thou canst not make one hair white or black. But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil.

In a nutshell, Jesus is basically saying that it is better not to make a vow than to promise or swear an oath that we may not fulfill, which will bring judgment on us. Unfulfilled promises not only hurt people in the short term, but they can also have long-lasting consequences and change the trajectory of your life. A great example of this is in the life of Judah, one of Jacob's 12 sons.

After his brother Joseph was sold into slavery, Judah moved away from the protection of his father Jacob and his family. He married a Canaanite woman (a BIG no-no!) and had three sons. He chose a Canaanite woman, Tamar, as a wife for his eldest son, Er. Er was wicked in the eyes of God, so God killed him. Next up was the second son, Onan. In those days if a man died with no children, it was the duty of the next son to marry the widow and have children with her. The only catch was that the children would carry the name of the dead brother. Onan didn't want to do that and took steps to prevent it. Because of his wickedness, God killed him as well. Now it was the third son's turn to marry Tamar. Judah, seeing his two sons were gone, feared losing his last son, so he told Tamar to go back and live in her father's house. He promised that when his last son, Shelah, was old enough, he would send for her.

But folks, Judah had NO intention of doing any such thing. His promise was made to be broken. Tamar got the hint once Shelah grew old enough for marriage and Judah didn't send for her like he promised. So, Tamar took matters into her own hands and came up with a plan. It was sheep shearing season, and she knew that Judah would be in her area.

It's better to give them the physical things (e.g., food, clothing) that they need. That's why it's said that "Faith without works is dead." The greatest benefit of community outreach programs is that the programs serve people who are often unable to help themselves.

#### How Can Bible Fellowship MBC Provide Outreach?

Participate in Local Events: There are festivals and community events in our area where we can set up a booth with our church information and interact with the community. Our participation will raise awareness of our church and what we offer, and we can get a feel for the needs of our community.

#### Target Leaders and Influencers:

We can research our community leaders and see where we can be of service to them first. Those leaders can then help us to see where we are needed.

#### Host Events, Trainings, and Seminars:

I mentioned before that community outreach programs serve people who are at-risk and underserved. We can provide education and services to groups of people who are simply not well-educated or who may be misinformed about certain topics. Hosting events, trainings, and seminars will provide important education to these people.

#### Use Our Building as a Haven:

We can use our building as a food kitchen. We could organize a canned food drive to donate to a food pantry or a clothing/toiletry drive for homeless or needy people to come by and pick up without fear of judgment. One thing Bible Fellowship is doing to help in the fight against Covid is providing our site for testing/vaccines.

#### Be an Advocate:

We as a church can be advocates for issues affecting our community, such as:

- Education. We can push for increased funding to provide better education to our youth.
- Air pollution. West Oakland and downtown Oakland communities are exposed to some of the highest levels of air pollution in the Bay Area.
- Poverty. Nearly 17% of Oakland residents are living below the poverty level.
- Public safety. We can support efforts to improve public safety.

As you can see, there's no excuse for not reaching out to the people who need our help. Service is contagious! Community service deepens our relationship with God and with our brothers and sisters. It's an occasion to spread Christ's teachings and become ambassadors for Christ.

Through outreach programs, God's people have the opportunity to spread the Gospel effectively. By committing ourselves to serve others, we attempt to demonstrate to God the love we have for Him.

She took off her widow's garments, dressed as a temple prostitute with a veil covering her face, sat by the side of the road, and tricked Judah into sleeping with her. Tamar became pregnant with twins as a result of that encounter.

After it became known that Widow Tamar was pregnant, Judah was more than willing to burn her to death, but as soon as it was revealed that he was the father, Judah had to face some hard truths. While Tamar was wrong to do what she did, it was done because of Judah's broken promise. His refusal to honor his word ended up causing him to commit a great sin and changed the trajectory of his life.

In the end, Judah declared that Tamar, a Canaanite woman, was more righteous than he was.

Jesus is really concerned about the condition of our hearts. It's not just simply how one acts, it's what is inside, the hidden part, that is the most important. Some people may think that by swearing upon other things (e.g., "My mother's grave," "My child's life," "a stack of Bibles"), it adds validity to their oath. But, if your hearts are pure, then you don't need any of that.

If we are true followers of Christ, our promises should be driven by our character. We won't need to swear by anything in order to be believed. Our word alone should be enough. So in life, let your Yea be yea and your Nay, nay!

### In The Spotlight – Sister Louise Arnett



Sister Louise Arnett is very quiet. Kind. And she'll say it herself, she is shy. "I mind my own business. I don't talk a lot but I'll say it if I have to; if it's good to say it." You will often see her with her sisterin-law, Sister Juanita Matthews. They have a friendship that goes

way back. To this day, they live within a few blocks of each other.

Sister Arnett grew up on a farm in Marianna, Arkansas, a small country town. There were seven kids in the family and they all worked on the farm and did the chores around the house. They did everything to help their parents. And they all worked. No exceptions. In her words, "Nobody was happy but they were used to life as it was."

Her family was active in church. Her mom sang in the choir. But only her mom! "We couldn't sing!" says Sister Arnett. "I never could sing. I remember once Andrew was in the car with me and I was singing along to the radio. He said, 'Grandmother, please stop singing with the radio.""

When she was about 10, she was baptized. As she explains it, "In the country, they would have a revival every year. The revival would be in the summer, in July or August, when it was warm." Those who accepted Jesus as their Savior were baptized in a pond of water outside the church. If you were saved at any other time of the year, you just waited until revival time to go in the water. Sister Arnett remembers, "They took me out a little way, but it was still close to the shore. I don't like deep water, don't swim. So it was scary. The water was dirty. I thought maybe there might be alligators or snakes in the water. Well, we didn't have alligators! But snakes, yes."

Sister Arnett met the love of her life in middle school. Brother Frank Arnett lived in a nearby town that was even smaller than Marianna. To attend junior high and high school, he had to go to school in Marianna. He was about two years older, so he graduated before she did.

At the age of 18, newly graduated from high school, and not too long married, Sister Arnett and her husband "hit the road." They moved to the Midwest. Kansas City was a big city, but it was different than out here.

Why Kansas City? Brother Frank's sister Juanita and her husband were there already. And that made it a good place to start. In Kansas City, she went to dental assistant school and then worked in a dental medical clinic for about 4 or 5 years. She worked at Sears, too. And she and Frank had three daughters: LaJuana, Beverly, and Veronica.

She was a member of her church's Mission Ministry when she lived in Kansas City. "We'd have Bible Study together. We'd go to the houses of the seniors who couldn't come to church, and have Bible Study. I liked that."

Sister Arnett and her family stayed in Kansas City from 1966 until 1977, when they moved to Oakland. Frank had not been feeling well for a long time, but he didn't talk about it. Didn't tell. He was private about it, didn't say much but, "Oh, I'll be better tomorrow." As she puts it, "You know, men pride: 'I'll be all right."

Brother Arnett called his sister Juanita and her husband, who had moved to Oakland by then, and they found an apartment for the Arnetts. It was on 8<sup>th</sup> and Foothill. The Arnett family lived there 2 or 3 years. (Continued Page 9)

They joined Bible Fellowship since it was within walking distance.

As she reminisced, I mentioned that she had been part of the Great Migration. This turned her mind to what it had been like, growing up. "If you were walking somewhere, strangers would stop to offer you a ride. They'd roll down the window and ask if you want a ride. There was no fear. We trusted each other. Everybody was your neighbor. And that's how you got to know them. In Arkansas."


There was no mixing between the races. "People knew ones who did, but there was no public dating across race. In those days, people weren't mixing. You stayed in your own place. All that's history now. Can't tell the children what it was like then; they don't even know!" I thought it was sad that they would not find out, but Louise straightened me out. "You want them to have their own view of the world. The past is bygones. It's over now. So live your life."

As for a scripture that inspires – "All are good. They give you hope; encourage you. I like *Trust in the Lord with all thine heart*. Helps you to keep going. Don't put your trust in men. Trust in God and you'll be all right."

Final word? "You can learn a lot, just listen!"

### Important Test for Men Over 50

#### <u>PSA</u>

The PSA test determines the level of prostate-specific antigen in the blood. A high PSA is an indicator of prostate cancer or such a similar health problem. PSA is one of the most important blood tests for men over 50 which helps pin down the health of the prostate. Men should get this blood test done every year after 50.

#### Testosterone:

With age, the testosterone levels in males begin to decline. This can give result to issues like fatigue, increasing weight, declining libido, erectile dysfunction, hair loss, bone loss, poor sleep quality, behavioral changes, etc. This is one of the most urged blood tests for men over 50, especially those who complain of the aforementioned issues.

#### Cholesterol:

One of the most crucial medical tests for men after 50 is the cholesterol blood test. In fact, doctors recommend all males who are over 35 (in case of smokers, diabetics and obese patients, over 20) to get their cholesterol checked every five years. testicular cancer.

#### Blood Sugar:


A blood sugar test is a blood test that determines the level of glucose in the blood, and, therefore, the risk of diabetes and insulin resistance. If left untreated, diabetes can even impact heart, eyes, skin and mental health, and result in many other issues like kidney disease and nerve damage. The repercussions of insulin resistance include high blood pressure, elevated cholesterol, increased weight, bloating, and elevated blood sugar. If you are a male over 50, make sure you get your blood sugar checked once in every 3 years.

#### Colonoscopy:

Another important medical test for men over 50 is colonoscopy – a test that screens patients for colorectal cancer. Other tests like sigmoidoscopy and fecal occult blood test are also used to determine colorectal health.




